

FrogWatch is now right in the heart of the Canberra Nature Map

The FrogWatch data portal has become a fully-fledged part of the Canberra Nature Map (CNM).



The move has secured better protection for our data, continuing updates & a slightly new look. But be aware: the Canberra Nature mapr APP does NOT work for FrogWatch surveys. FrogWatch survey data needs to be entered via the webpage (from a computer or your phone).

You will need to take a few different steps in order to get to the online survey sheet:

1. go to Canberra Nature Map- log on → go to ADD A SIGHTING → click on SURVEYS → click on the FW logo → click on add a survey

Frogwatch Census Training Events

Spring is around the corner and so is the annual FrogTober, the month of our local FrogCensus. Before heading out to collect vital data (simply by listening to the frog calls), it is necessary to attend one of our training events. You will learn all about when, how, where and why to look out for frogs. No previous knowledge required. Just rug up, bring your favourite torch and wear sturdy shoes. Each event runs from 18:00 - 20:00 and includes some theory, spiked with plenty of fun frog facts, and ID practice during a walk to a nearby frog habitat.
